CRS Nigeria Visit

FJDP had the honor of hosting a high-powered delegation from Catholic Relief Services at our head office. The Coordinator, alongside the FJDP Programme Manager, warmly welcomed the esteemed guests and expressed sincere gratitude for their visit.

The purpose of their visit was to explore deeper collaboration opportunities with CRS to enhance assistance for displaced persons in Benue State. During the meeting, the FJDP Programme Manager highlighted existing gaps and challenges faced by IDPs, emphasizing the need to improve living conditions in the camps and empower residents with essential livelihood skills.

Following the meeting, the team visited Daudu Camp 1 for a post-distribution monitoring exercise and engaged directly with IDPs. The residents, who turned out in large numbers, welcomed the team warmly and expressed gratitude for the provisions of food items and sleeping mats through FJDP. The atmosphere was filled with joy as the IDPs appreciated the support received.

We extend our heartfelt thanks to CRS for their funding support and partnership, which continues to significantly enhance the living conditions of IDPs in Benue State.



Food and Non Food Assistance to IDPs in Daudu Camp 1

In our ongoing effort to provide relief assistance to IDPs affected by conflicts between herders and farmers in Benue State, FJDP is collaborating with CRS on a project aimed at assisting 3000 vulnerable IDPs in Makurdi, Guma, Gwer West, and Gwer East LGAs.

Recently, FJDP initiated the distribution of essential items to IDPs at Daudu Camp 1. The distribution included sleeping mats, mosquito nets, rice, oil, salt, and Tom Brown for malnourished children. These items were crucially needed and have been warmly received by the IDPs, who expressed deep gratitude to CRS for the timely support. Proper nutrition, which has been a significant challenge in the camps, is now more accessible thanks to these provisions.

We extend our sincere appreciation to CRS for their invaluable funding support, which has made this initiative possible






Essential Food and Non-Food Aid

In a continuation of our efforts, FJDP extended the distribution of food and non-food items to Gwer West Local Government Area in Benue State, a critical location for our projects. Led by the Administrative Manager, the distribution specifically targeted Agagbe community within Gwer West LGA, despite ongoing herders attacks and instability.

We successfully reached 200 households comprising 1,200 individuals in the Agagbe camp. The displaced persons expressed immense gratitude, noting that few organizations venture into the area due to persistent attacks, which often leave them isolated and in need. FJDP, in collaboration with CRS, was able to provide vital assistance that was deeply appreciated by the community.

UNHCR Country Representative familiarization visit to IDP Camps in Benue State

UNHCR Head of Sub-Office Ogoja Visits Ichwa Camp

FJDP had the privilege of hosting the head of the sub-office Ogoja during her visit in preparation for the upcoming high-level mission.

Her visit aimed to follow up on the progress and preparations made by FJDP for the impending mission. She also visited the IDP camp to assess the preparations for the children’s parliament and the income-generating activities (IGA) groups for men and women.

Later, a meeting was held with the management and staff of FJDP to address any gaps identified and to commend the efforts made so far in preparation for the mission.





The Ichwa IDP Camp in Benue State, Nigeria, is one of the many camps where FJDP is currently working in partnership with UNHCR. This camp now serves as a home for thousands of IDPs displaced from their ancestral homes. To offer protection services, FJDP has carried out activities aimed at safeguarding and supporting the well-being of these displaced children, promoting their psychosocial health and overall development.

The children participated in dance and various sports activities such as skipping, board games, and sack races, all under the guidance of FJDP staff. These activities are crucial in rebuilding the lives of these displaced persons, with women and children being the most affected. Additionally, FJDP staff conducted the Engaging Men in Accountable Practices (EMAP) program, teaching men the essential practices needed to ensure the camp is free from all forms of violence against women and girls





Protection induction training at the Refugee settlement

We held a protection induction training targeting the community outreach facilitators at the Ikyogen refugee settlement.

The session enhanced understanding on protection principles, child protection, gender-based violence, prevention from sexual, exploitation and abuse, the rights of refugees and displaced persons as well as provided practical skills for identifying, assessing, and responding to protection concerns, including reporting mechanisms and referral pathways.



Empowering IDPs at Ichwa Camp with Sustainable Livelihoods



FJDP, in collaboration with UNHCR, visited the BIPC factory, where six vulnerable IDPs and one refugee have been enrolled for training. These individuals will receive hands-on experience in bread and water production, as well as packaging, which will equip them with valuable skills.

This initiative is designed to empower them, providing a sustainable livelihood that reduces their dependence on aid from NGOs, individuals, and the government.

UNHCR Delegation Visits Ichwa IDP Camp: Strengthening Humanitarian Efforts in Benue

FJDP, in partnership with UNHCR, welcomed a high-powered delegation to Benue State, Nigeria.

The visit aimed to provide a firsthand experience of the displacement situation in the state.

The Governor of Benue State led the delegation to the Ichwa IDP camp. The delegation included Mr. Raouf Mazou, Assistant High Commissioner (Operations) for UNHCR; Ms. Ruvendrini Menikdiwela, Assistant High Commissioner (Protection) for UNHCR; Mr. Abdouraouf Gnon Konde, Regional Director, Bureau for West and Central Africa, UNHCR; Ms. Annett Günther, Ambassador of the Federal Republic of Germany to Nigeria; Ms. Liz Ahua, Former Director, UNHCR; Mr. Arjun Jain, UNHCR Country Representative for Nigeria; Ms. Paola Pace, IOM Chief of Mission; Ms. Irene Omondi, UNHCR Head of Sub Office for Ogoja, Nigeria; and Ms. Lara Scholterbeck, Senior External Engagement Coordinator, Bureau for West and Central Africa, UNHCR.



The delegation was surprised by the conditions faced by the IDPs due to displacement. Highlights of the visit included an exhibition of Income Generating Activities (IGA) such as Sweet Mama Meal, Sweet Mama Kulikuli, and beads made by the IDP and refugee women. The UNHCR delegation interacted with the IDPs, encouraging them to remain calm and assuring them that help would arrive soon. As a gesture of appreciation, the refugee women presented gifts to the UNHCR delegation, acknowledging their ongoing support for the refugees and IDPs in Benue State.

FJDP AND NDE EXPLORES VISTAS OF PARTNERSHIP FOR LEI



FJDP through the SCORE Programme conducted an Advocacy Mission to the Private Residence of the Director General of National Directorate of Employment (NDE), Hon. Silas Ali Agara in his Private Residence in Akwanga, Nasarawa state to Advocate for Livelihood and Economic Inclusion (LEI) of Pastoralists and Farmers across Benue and Nasarawa states on the 24th August, 2024

Team FJDP and the DG of NDE, Hon. Silas Ali Agara interfaced as the Programme Manager, Valentine Kwaghchimmin gave the advocacy message highlighting the pitiable situation of the affected populations. He specifically appealed and requested for partnership with NDE through training and empowering pastoralists and farmers which in the opinion of the SCORE Programme, will help them in bouncing back to reconnect and rebuild their lives.

The PM further requested for another meeting which will discuss details and specifics of the partnership. In conclusion, the Administrative Manager, Blessing ADZAAGEE handed over advocacy products to the DG.

Responding, the DG appreciated team FJDP for the advocacy visit and the initiative which is aimed at reducing unemployment and the sufferings of pastoralists and farmers whose livelihood has been impacted negatively by the prolonged conflict. He expressed the readiness and willingness of his office in supporting populations in rebuilding their lives through economic empowerment.

Hon. Agara concluded by informing the team that NDE will soon roll out LEI programmes across the country and would definitely welcome partnership such as the one proposed by FJDP. He reiterated the need for FJDP to visit him in no distant time to discuss the specifics of the partnership as NDE also requires partnership/support in mapping and profiling of beneficiaries as the existing register is considered to be grossly defective and FJDP may come in handy

Creating Lasting Impact: The Gbajimba IDP Shelter Project



We had the opportunity to visit the Gbajimba 1 and 2 camps, situated in Nzorov, Gbajimba LGA of Benue State. These camps are among the locations where FJDP has been actively implementing programs since 2019 to support internally displaced persons (IDPs).

In 2020, FJDP, in partnership with UNHCR, the United Nations Trust Fund for Human Security (UNTFHS), UNDP, and FAO, embarked on a significant project aimed at providing more sustainable living conditions for the IDPs in Gbajimba. As part of this initiative, 49 semi-detached pilot shelters were constructed, offering much-needed stability and a sense of permanence to the displaced families.

The project, titled "Transitioning From Humanitarian Relief to Long-Term Development," was designed to go beyond immediate relief efforts by focusing on the long-term needs of the IDPs. The construction of these shelters not only provided safer and more dignified living conditions but also played a crucial role in promoting a sense of community and hope among the displaced persons.

The impact of this project has been profound. The IDPs who benefited from these shelters now enjoy a level of security and comfort that was previously unimaginable in their makeshift camps. These shelters have become a foundation upon which they can begin to rebuild their lives, offering them protection from the elements and a stable environment to raise their families.

The success of this project would not have been possible without the invaluable support of UNHCR and our other partners. Their commitment and collaboration were instrumental in turning this vision into reality. We are deeply grateful to all the organizations involved for their dedication to improving the lives of those who have been displaced by conflict.




Support Needed
